Program Description

The Community Health Promotion for Aboriginal Communities program has been developed in collaboration with the Inter Tribal Health Authority (ITHA) to provide students with a basic knowledge in community health education, health promotion, injury prevention and community development within Aboriginal communities. Graduates from this program will have the skills to assess community and client health education needs and will be well prepared to work within the community on improving health and well-being through health promotion.

Program Delivery

- Criminal Record Check: Practicums will require a satisfactory criminal record check prior to placement. These are requested through VIU. Prospective students will be contacted by mail by VIU regarding requirements. These are processed through the Ministry. An RCMP check is not sufficient
- Valid Class 5 Driver's License may be required for some locations

<p>Application Deadline All applications must be submitted and complete, with all required documentation. Applications received after this date will be considered if seats are available. <i>Note: If prerequisites are “in progress”, conditional acceptance may be granted as long as assessments/courses are successfully completed two weeks prior to program start.</i></p>	Accepted until Sept 15, 2017. However, late applications accepted if seats available.
<p>Fee payment deadline: Nonrefundable deposit of \$200 due within three weeks of offer of admission. Balance of fees are due by September 9, 2017. There will be no refunds after the program starts.</p>	
<p>Graduation Requirements: Students will require a minimum Grade Point Average of a C (2.0) for the required courses in order to be awarded the program certificate.</p>	
<p>Tuition for 2017-18: Funding has been obtained, the tuition will be reduced by up to 50% from \$7100</p>	\$3600*
